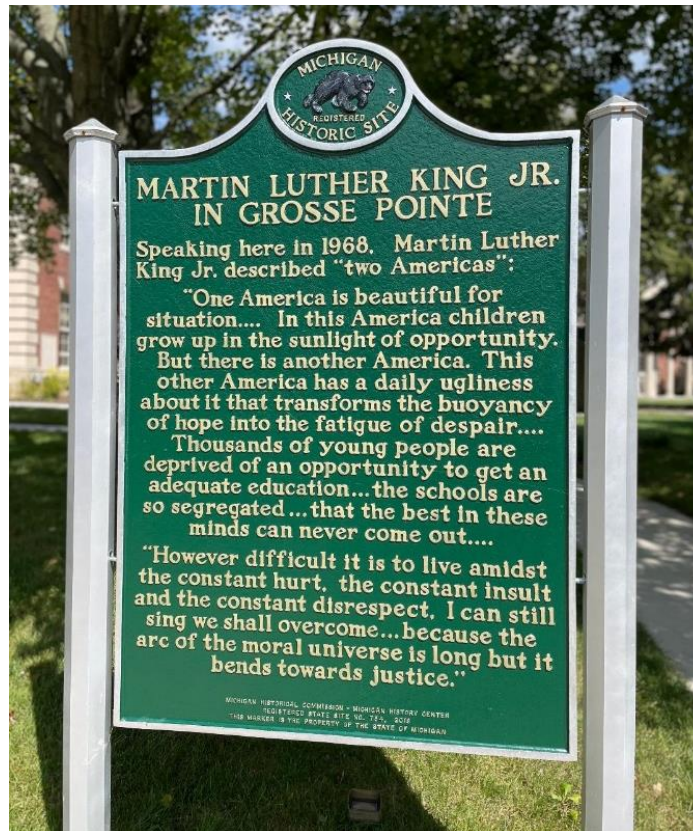


# See Racism for What it Is

**We commend the Grosse Pointe Board of Realtors for raising funds and leading efforts to place the recently dedicated marker commemorating Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s speech at Grosse Pointe High School in March of 1968, and for acknowledging their own historic role in segregating housing in the Pointes.**

**However, a dedication ceremony more than fifty years later that features only white people and no current Grosse Pointe Public School System students demonstrates the persistence of exclusionary practices in our community.**

**MLK's challenge rings true today. "And we will never solve the problem of racism until there is a recognition of the fact that racism still stands at the center of so much of our nation and we must see racism for what it is," he said. We hope the plaque motivates students, parents and teachers to keep working toward this still far from realized vision.**
